



No Watering Alert FAQs

Who does the water restrictions apply to?

The water restrictions in place apply to both commercial and residential consumers of the Jericho Water District.

Can I water my lawn?

The emergency notice pertains to lawn watering. All residents and commercial businesses must turn off their above-ground and/or automatic lawn sprinklers until further notice.

Can I water my flowering (perennial and annual) plants and vegetable gardens?

Homeowners can water their garden beds and potted patio plants by hand watering with a hose with an automatic shut off nozzle.

How does this alert affect new plantings?

New plantings can be watered using a drip-type or soaker hose system. No above-ground sprinklers are allowed.

Can I fill my swimming pool?

Swimming pools are exempt from the alert. Some pools have an automatic fill that keeps the water above a certain level. However, if work is to be scheduled on a pool, it would be best to wait until after the summer season to drain and refill a pool.

How can I create a more water conscious garden?

Choosing a native garden of xeric plants conserves water. These types of plants thrive in dry conditions. Visit our website for a full list of Xeric plants (<https://www.jerichowater.org/conservation/landscaping/>). Summer irrigation quadruples average monthly water demand. Choosing these types of perennials, flowers, shrubs and trees can drastically reduce your properties water consumption.

How I confirm that my automatic sprinklers are off?

Sign in to your EyeOnWater account and review your hourly consumption graphs.

I think I may have a leak, what should I do?

It is important to rectify leaks in a timely manner in order to assist us with our conservation efforts.
